During the week of September 24-28, Congress will commence “Congressional Sportsmen’s Week” in an effort to highlight the vital importance of hunting, fishing, and outdoor recreation to America’s economy, environment, health, and way of life.

Sportsmen’s Week will follow National Hunting and Fishing Day on September 22. Legislative activity will include passing resolutions recognizing the important contributions of sportsmen and women, and committee consideration of important conservation initiatives. Additionally the Congressional Sportsmen’s Caucus Foundation will announce the release of a new report detailing the economic impact of the sportsmen’s community.
